


## **AMPHIBIANS AND REPTILES: An Introduction to Their Natural History and Conservation**

Well organized, clearly written, richly illustrated with black-and-white and color photographs and diagrams, and infused with substance, this book will inform the reader with knowledge about the basic biology, ecology, and natural history of amphibians and reptiles, and — unusual for books written for this audience — about their conservation needs: that their populations are declining throughout the world, why these populations are declining, and what human beings can do to help save these animals. The book concludes with a chapter on what kids in particular can do, and should not do, to help protect and preserve amphibians and reptiles.




## **CHILDREN OF THE SEVENTH FIRE: An Ancient Prophecy for Modern Times**






Storyteller and artist John Peyton uses his marvelous skills as storyteller and artist to give children and adults a glimpse of Ojibway life in the Northwoods during the early 20th century. In Peyton's fully illustrated *Voices from the Ice*, a young boy and his family leave the hunger and isolation of their winter camp and make their way across the still snow-covered land and frozen streams, hoping to join the rest of their people at the sugarbush. There is a race against the thawing ice, beneath which lie spirits, some of which are waiting to cut off the family from the bounty of spring while others seek to ensure their safe journey. Those who walk on the ice of late winter must listen as it speaks if they are to reach their destination safely.

## ALPHABETICAL BOOKS IN COLOR

Lawrence Hohman

Larry Hohman has combined his career as a commercial artist and his deep love of nature to create five lovely children's ABC books. Each book contains, in alphabetical order and corresponding to the appropriate letter, colorful and beautifully detailed drawings of a bird, beast (wild mammal), plant, or butterfly in its natural habitat. His newest edition, *Alphabetical Breeds in Color*, released in 2010, contains domestic breeds of dog. The quality and details of illustrations alone place these books above most others, so much so that you might be tempted to frame each page! The rhyming verses for each animal contain information about their biology and life histories, such as hunting for food, protecting their young, vocalizing, or moving about. In *Alphabetical Botanicals in Color*, the author's rhyming verses describe each plant. In *Alphabetical Butterflies in Color*, Hohman illustrates and describes butterflies representing all 26 letters of the alphabet, and each butterfly's name is followed by its region of habitat and preferred botanical. For *Alphabetical Beasts In Color* and *Alphabetical Breeds in Color* the animal's or breed's name and country of origin is listed. A listing on the inside back cover of each book identifies each animal/plant with the alphabetical letter it represents.
